


Term 1 Curriculum Overview

Maths: We are enhancing our maths teaching this year by adding onto our current problem solving with an approach called developing mathematical inquiries. We are supported by our fantastic maths facilitator, Lucie Cheeseman. Go to Lucie's parent evening on **Monday the 15th of February** to find out more about this!

Writing: This term we have a focus on PERSUASIVE writing to tie in with our inquiry unit. Students will learn about persuasive language features, formal letter writing and advertising to persuade.

Inquiry: Our inquiry unit this term is called Kaitiaki O Waitematā (Guardians of Waitematā) and will focus on ways in which we can help to protect our ocean. We are currently working closely with Matt Hart to implement a creative problem solving approach to our inquiry units throughout the year - 'BIFKIDS' (Big Ideas Faster).



Have you ever wondered what mathematics teaching looks like in a 21st century classroom? Or how you can help your child develop mathematical confidence as well as progress?

Come to this session with Lucie Cheeseman and find the answers to these questions and many more. We will be exploring:

- How has mathematics education changed and what maths looks like in the classroom today.
- How to develop the characteristics of an effective, confident and resilient mathematician.
- How to encourage and foster a mathematical problem solving approach
- Practical ideas, strategies and support that you can offer at home.



Lucie has been a mathematics facilitator for the past 12 years. She has presented at Leadership conferences, PCT courses, National conferences and within many varied schools across Auckland. She has a special interest in acceleration programmes in mathematics, curriculum leadership, developing professional learning groups, and enabling student agency.








Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC)

Year 5 and Year 6 Goat Island Trips - 8th March (room 6&9) 9th March (7&23) and 10th March 5&8)

Purpose: To inspire and promote passion and excitement for New Zealand's underwater environment and promote interest and extended learning of the world around us, within a safe environment led by experts.

The Guided Snorkel Experience Program for school groups is a snorkel lesson and guided tour with the Goat Island Dive & Snorkel Dive Masters. The Guided Snorkel is fantastic for all experience levels, from those who are new to snorkelling and swimming to the more experienced snorkeler looking to improve their skills. The Dive Masters keep students safe and comfortable and will give the confidence they need to enjoy the water. For those who have experience snorkelling, we focus on enhancing skills and provide advanced techniques.

Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC)

Year 5 and Year 6 Goat Island Trips - 8th March (room 6&9) 9th March (7&23) and 10th March 5&8)

Students will rotate between snorkelling and visiting the Goat Island Marine Discovery Centre.
