- Sleeping marae-style in the school hall, developing deeper connections with our kura and whenua


















NZ Surf Academy



Our popular 'Beach Safety Days' give students the confidence to be active and have fun in the ocean through the enjoyment of learning how to surf.




























Tree Adventures - Woodhill Forest







Starting off at just 2m and building up to 15m above the forest floor, the activities increase in difficulty; getting wobblier, longer and more challenging as you progress.

































- Parents know what is expected of them
- Parents sign a parent agreement document prior any overnight activity involving the children.
- Parents sign a document stating they have no criminal convictions
- Parents are aware that no alcohol is consumed on school trips and no smoking at child centered activities.
- If any parent helper's behaviour is deemed inappropriate by the trip leader, the trip leader has the Board's power to act, including the right to ask the parent helper to leave.
- Most importantly when you are a helper you are not on holiday- you are there to help to make this a truly memorable experience for all the children, not just your own.
