We are not far from the end of the year and as you know it is going to be a busy few weeks. On Monday we held our school Athletics Day for our Year 3-6 students, we were very fortunate with the weather! The children were outstanding, it was nice to see all our students involved and having fun. The future is bright for our future athletes as we have some pretty outstanding runners who are very talented in track and field. All the results from the day can be viewed on our school website. A big thank you to Mr Connor for another well organised event and also to all our parents who helped out on the day.

Today you would have received your students' report, it has been pleasing to see the progress our students have made this year. We have had two very disruptive years with lockdowns, Term 1 this year we saw a wave of Covid hit our school which resulted in teacher and students absence. As a school and the board our focus has been on how we can give our Tamariki the best chance to progress through two years of disruption. We have always communicated that, during the last two years some of our students have regressed and this was a nationwide trend. Our learning from lockdown as the nation now understands, is that teaching online is not the same as face to face teaching. So the school and board decided to invest in small class sizes for our students, and we have been able to do this through our fundraising and through board funding. Smaller class sizes means more one to one time with the teachers and this really enables teachers to develop connections and relationships with students. Differentiated programs in classrooms meets the needs of our students. We will continue to analyse the data from our end of year reports and this will give us the information for our focus areas for next year.

A reminder that our Three way learning conversation will take place next Tuesday and Wednesday.

ERO released a report to the media regarding school attendance earlier this month. The data relates to term two, a time when schools were in the midst of rolling isolation absences. Our attendance rate for the entire school year to date is 92%, this includes justified absences like illness and unjustified absences like holidays outside of the regular school holiday period.

We had one of the highest attendance rates in our local area. important and we monitor absences carefully.


