Kia ora koutou,

A big thank you to all of our parents who attended your child's Three Way Learning Conferences this week. When we look back over the past two years, we actually have not been able to have these conversations face to face, and from feedback received by our teachers, they really enjoyed meeting some of you for the first time. A big thank you to the staff for all their hard work over the year, they have all worked really hard to get our students learning back on track. Francis, Susan and I have been assessing our end of year data and were impressed with the progress our students have made. We have seen a huge shifts of students moving from within standard to above and this a credit to our teachers and also our Board of Trustees for allowing us to operate smaller class sizes. All schools throughout New Zealand are funded by the Ministry of Education on the following ratios:

- Yr 0 1= 18 students to one teacher
- Yr 2 3 = 23 students to one teacher
- Yr 4 6 = 29 students to one teacher

So when we look at the class sizes in our kura, we are extremely fortunate to run the classes at the numbers we currently are. This can only be done with the help of our fundraising and school donations that are used to fund over and above the smaller class ratios our students' education benefits from.

The now outdated decile system targets more funding to those schools with a higher proportion of students living in overcrowded homes or whose parents have low levels of income, employment or education. We are a decile 10 school because we have a low incidence of these challenges in our community and as a result, we receive the lowest level of Government funding (almost \$1,000 less per student per year compared to a decile 1 school). So a big thank you to all of you have paid your donations, they really make a difference to our education programmes.

A big thank you to the the fabulous Puriri syndicate for hosting last weeks assembly. It was yet another successful assembly.
