

We are actively seeking sponsors for this year's Guy Fawkes Night - any level of sponsorship is gratefully received and we're only too happy to sing your name from the rooftops.





# Room of the week Room 8



# 150 YEARS CELEBRATION

#### Kia Ora Parents and Whānau.

We have our exciting 150 Years Celebration week coming up on the last week of our school term. Please see below the range of activities taking place throughout the week.

1873 - 2023

#### Monday 18th September

On Monday we will kick off our school celebrations with a technology free day centred around the past. Students are encouraged to dress up as if they were a student from the olden days. This is completely optional. The year 5 students will also be hosting their exciting annual carnival from 11:30 am to 1pm.

#### **Tuesday 19th September**

Our theme for Tuesday is the present day. During the day the students will take part in an exciting school quiz with their buddy classes. We will be planting a rimu tree to pay homage to the ancient rimu tree that once stood at the intersection of Karangahape Road and Ponsonby Road. This tree was so sacred to the Māori people that they named the area of Ponsonby after it - Te Rimu Tahi. Unfortunately the tree was cut down during the New Zealand land wars. Our aim is for our school's rimu tree to become a taonga (treasure) for our school for many years to come. After the tree planting ceremony, we will take a whole school photo in the shape of the number 150!

#### Wednesday 20th September

On Wednesday our whole school theme is focused around the future. Students will be given the opportunity to all write a wish that they have for our school for the future. We will also be running a whole school Lego Masters competition and to top off the day we will be burying a school time capsule. Each class will be creating some items to add into the capsule. There will be a story competition running in Week 9 and the winning entries will also be placed in the capsule.

#### Thursday 21st September

Our 150 Years Celebration evening will take place from 5:00 - 8:00 pm on Thursday 21st of September.
